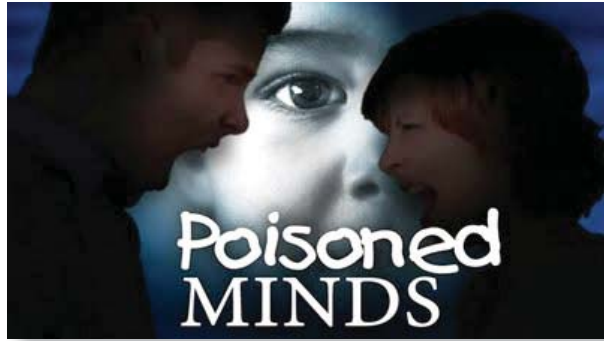
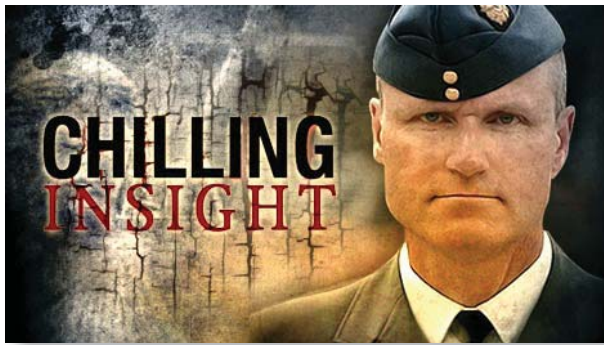

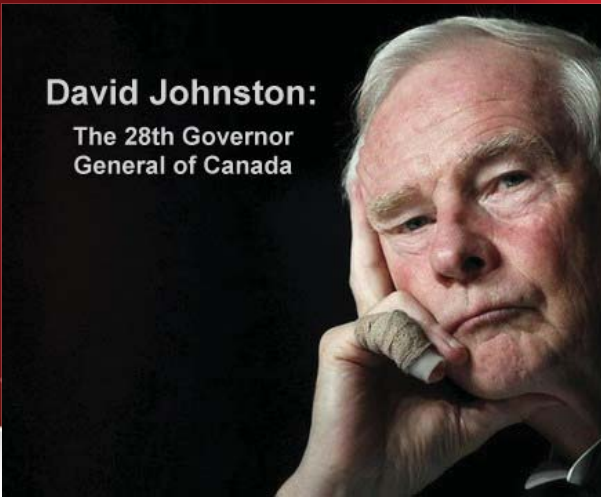

Canada is a “barn raising” nation with a strong history of neighbours looking out for each other, said Canada’s new Governor General David Johnston in one of his first sit-down interviews since assuming the role. Johnston, who was sworn in as Canada’s 28th Governor General on Oct. 1, told CTV’s Canada AM it’s a characteristic that has shaped Canada in the past and will keep it strong in the future.

Johnston, who succeeded former governor general Michaëlle Jean in the role, has a long and successful career in academia and has worked with both the Conservatives and Liberals on various projects. In his inaugural speech, Johnston outlined his plans to make families, education and volunteerism the focus during his time at Rideau Hall. “The broad theme is a smart and caring nation -- two adjectives each powerful and important. And under that we have three pillars, the first is family and children, the second is learning and innovation and the third is

philanthropy and volunteerism.” This is a wonderful opportunity to meet Canada’s newest Governor General as well as getting a brief glimpse of the swearing-in ceremony. A great resource for History and Social Studies classes to help students understand the role of the Governor General.

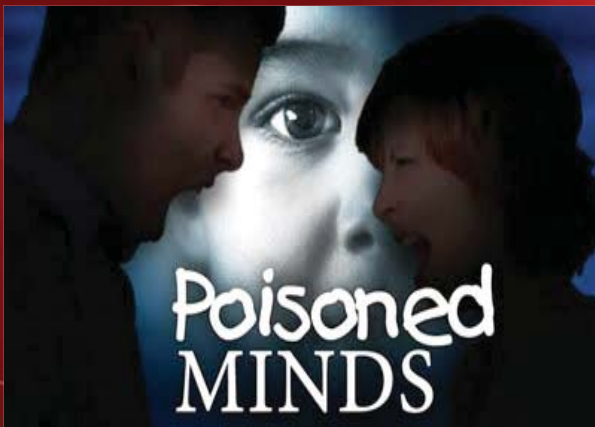
Dr. Gordon Keller, Director: McEwen Centre

The world of divorce is scary for any child. Even when spouses split amicably children can be forced to balance their love and time between two parents.

But when a divorce becomes especially toxic, children can become the target of an unrelenting crusade by one parent to destroy the child's relationship with the other. Experts call it parental alienation, a persistent campaign by one parent to poison a child's relationship with the other parent.

Typical tactics include lying or making false allegations about the targeted parent, refusing to let the child see the other parent, even punishing the child for showing affection for the other parent. Experts claim, in its more extreme forms, it is child abuse.

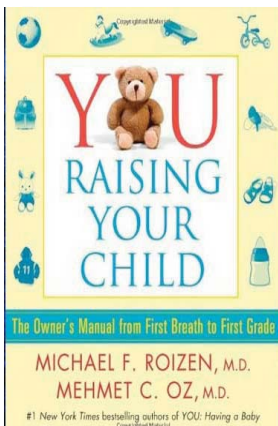

BULLYING THROUGH THE AGES: Canada AM

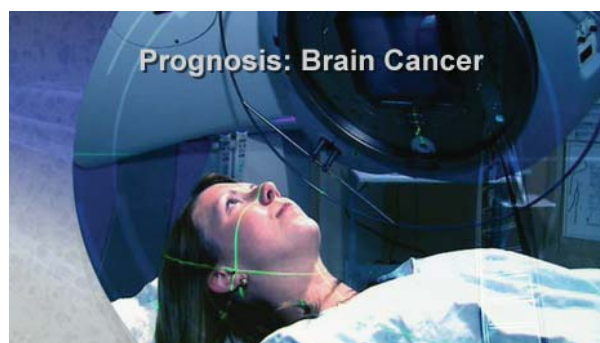

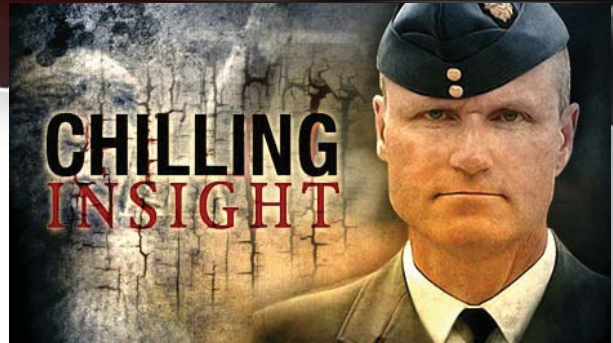
